Birchmount School is a K-8 school in a residential area in the North End of Moncton. We serve the families within the neighbourhood in and around Birchmount School on Ayer Avenue, as well as students who choose Early French Immersion from the Beaverbrook School catchment and students who choose the Late French Immersion program from the Queen Elizabeth School catchment.

Our school has approximately 600 students. We have 50 teachers, 1 behaviour intervention mentor, 20 educational assistants, 1 English as an additional language tutor, 2 administrative assistants, and 4 custodians.

DRESS CODE

Students must always dress for the weather conditions. Outdoor time is essential for students' physical and emotional well-being. Birchmount students go outside in most weather conditions, including light rain.

MORNING SUPERVISION

Supervision on our school grounds begins daily at 8:10 AM. For safety reasons, students are not permitted to be on the school grounds before that time.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is vital for your child's academic success and overall development. Attending school consistently ensures that students fully participate in learning activities, stay up-to-date with the curriculum, and build strong relationships with their peers and teachers. When students are regularly present, they develop important habits of responsibility, time management, and commitment essential for their future success. We encourage all families to prioritize regular attendance and communicate with the school if

any challenges arise. By working together, we can help every student reach their full potential.

When a student is required to be absent, Birchmount School uses the absence management system [Safe Arrival](#) to support student safety and make it easy for you to let the school know about your child's absence.

LATE ARRIVALS

All Bears must be at school and ready to learn by 8:30 a.m. This on-time arrival sets the tone for the day. To ensure the safety of all Bears, students who arrive after 8:35 must sign in at the office before proceeding to class. Our drop-off zone will be open and supervised from 8:10 to 8:30 a.m. Please ensure your Bear is on time to prevent disrupting the classroom learning environment.

In collaboration with the Province of New Brunswick, we are proud to support the delivery of lunch meals in your school, making it easier to plan ahead while ensuring students receive nutritious and delicious food.

The Lunch Program is open to all families within your school community. We are passionate about supporting busy parents while providing students with satisfying, high-quality meals!

Starting <<**August 31, 2026**>>, families can access and order from their school's Lunch Program. Families can place or cancel meal orders up until 8:00 a.m. the day before. Monday meal orders must be submitted by 8:00 a.m. on the previous Friday. Menus follow a two-week cycle with three meal options each day and can be ordered up to four weeks in advance.

CELL PHONE POLICY

Birchmount School is dedicated to creating a focused and distraction-free learning environment, which is why we are a cell phone-free school. To support this policy, students must keep their cell phones turned off or on silent and stored in their lockers or backpacks throughout the school day. While we prefer that students leave their cell phones at home, we understand that some families need them for communication. We appreciate families' support in helping us enforce this policy and ensuring that all students follow our cell phone-free guidelines. Birchmount School is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged cell phones.

If a parent or guardian needs to contact their child during school hours, they should call the school office.

If a student is found using a cell phone during school hours, we will take the following steps:

- Remind the student of our cell phone-free expectations and reinforce the policy.
- Inform families that the student has violated the policy and request their support in reinforcing expectations at home.
- Repeated violations will be reported to the administration, who may confiscate the phone for the rest of the day or require parents to pick it up from the office.

COMMUNICATION

Birchmount School is dedicated to maintaining regular and open communication with our families. Each Sunday, we send out a weekly email containing important updates and reminders that apply to our entire school community. Additionally, our website is a valuable resource for information.

We take great responsibility for educating and caring for your child. We appreciate your understanding and respect for teachers' judgement and authority. Maintaining professional communication with our staff is essential for fostering a positive and productive environment.

Please keep the following guidelines in mind:

- Teachers are not permitted to communicate via text messaging or social media.
- Our teachers have scheduled daily responsibilities, including supervising students and teaching classes. Due to the time required for lesson preparation and student engagement, teachers may only be able to respond to emails or phone calls after

some time. However, they will strive to acknowledge or respond to communications within two school days.

- Your child's homeroom teacher is your first point of contact for day-to-day questions related to attendance, school events, or family concerns.
- For curriculum-related questions, please reach out to the specific subject teacher.
- Teachers are unable to discuss other students or colleagues to maintain integrity and respect within our school community. This ensures that we uphold our code of ethics.
- We kindly ask that all communication with our teachers remains respectful and professional. If a conversation or email exchange becomes inappropriate, it may be necessary to conclude the interaction until it can be resumed constructively.

SAFE DROP OFF AND BUS LOADING ZONE

To ensure the safety of all students, Birchmount School has implemented the following procedures for morning drop-off and end-of-day pick-up.

Morning Drop-Off

- **Shared Area:** The bus loading zone and kiss and drop share the same space.
 - **Bus Lane:** Right lane, closest to the soccer field.
 - **Kiss and Drop Lane:** Left lane, closest to the staff parking lot.
- **Child's Seating Position:** Have your child seated on the passenger side of the backseat.
- **Process:**
 - Drive into the kiss-and-drop lane following the traffic flow.
 - A volunteer will open the passenger door and guide your child to the crosswalk.
 - Ensure your child is ready to exit with their backpack in hand.
- **No Passing:** There is no passing in the kiss-and-drop lane. If additional time is needed, park in a designated area.

End-of-Day Pick-Up

- **Kiss and Drop Lane:** Expect slower traffic. Use alternative pick-up locations or park in designated areas.
- **Alternative Pick-Up Locations:** Meet your child at nearby streets or outside the kiss-and-drop zone.
- **Parking Options:**
 - **School Parking Lot:** Available if space permits.
 - **Ayer Ave:** Additional parking in front of the parking lot.

Thank you for your cooperation in keeping drop-off and pick-up safe and efficient.

END OF DAY DISMISSAL

At the end of the school day, all students in Kindergarten through grade 2 must be physically handed over to a parent, guardian, or an approved caregiver. Only older siblings who are 12 years of age or older can be considered approved caregivers.

School grounds and playgrounds are used as instructional and learning areas during the school day. For safety reasons, families and community members are not permitted on school property until the end of the school day.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES & CLUBS

Birchmount School is excited to offer various sports and extracurricular activities throughout the year. Some of the activities we provide include Cross-Country, Track and Field, Soccer, Basketball, Cheer, Volleyball, Noon Intramurals, Drama, Dungeons and Dragons, GSA, Culture Club, Rockband, Glee/Choir, Girls at Bat, and Softball.

Please note that the availability of these activities depends on the number of students interested and the availability of adult coaches or supervisors. We always need more coaches and volunteers to help run these activities and clubs. If you are interested in getting involved, please get in touch with your child's teacher, who can connect you with the appropriate person.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

At Birchmount School, we offer several leadership opportunities for our older Bears:

- **Playground Pals:** These students assist our younger Bears during recess, ensuring they have a fun and safe time outdoors.
- **Lunch Monitors:** These leaders join our younger Bears in the classroom during lunchtime, helping them with tasks like opening snacks and offering support when needed.
- **TLC (The Leadership Council):** This group organizes and runs various events within our school community.

If your child is interested in these leadership roles, please encourage them to speak with one of their teachers for more information.
